It is with heavy hearts that we share the news of the passing of our North Island colleague, Derek Perrault. Derek passed away in hospital in Campbell River on July 2, 2024, following an abrupt decline in health over the past couple of weeks.

Derek joined BCEHS 11 years ago, when he felt the call to fulfill a need in his community of Alert Bay. His dedication to his community carried him through his years of service and to becoming a cherished driver at station 102.

Derek was known for his quick wit, bright smile, and ability to find the perfect fix to any problem. He always found a way to make a lasting impression on his colleagues, particularly with his on-air catchphrase that would leave them smiling, "102 Kilo is 10-7 at......the station!"

During this difficult time, our thoughts and deepest sympathies go out to Derek's family and friends as they navigate through this profound loss. We also extend our support to all of Derek's North Island colleagues who are undoubtedly feeling the impact of this loss.

Funeral details will be communicated to all staff once they are finalized.
